

Spring 2026 SFL Community Report Executive Summary

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Academics

- The Spring 2026 All-SFL GPA of 3.481 is above the All-KU average of 3.459
 - This a **2.38% decrease** from the spring 2025 GPA of 3.564
 - The All-SFL GPA has been above the All-KU GPA for **12 consecutive semesters**.
- 19 chapters semester GPA is above the All-KU average of 3.459.
- The Spring 2026 All-Sorority GPA of 3.553 is above the All-Undergraduate Female GPA of a 3.459.
 - This is a **2.91% decrease** from the spring 2025 All-Sorority GPA of a 3.563
- The Spring 2026 All-Fraternity GPA of 3.308 is above the All-Undergraduate Male GPA of a 3.261.
 - This is a **0.09% decrease** from the spring 2025 All-Fraternity GPA of 3.311

Education, Leadership Development and Community Building

- The executive boards for the Interfraternity Council (IFC), the Multicultural Greek Council (MGC), the National Pan-Hellenic Council (NPHC), and the Panhellenic Association (PHA) all attended the [Association of Fraternal Leadership and Values Central Conference](#) in Indianapolis, in Late January.
 - IFC also sponsored five-chapter presidents to attend.
- More than 80-chapter presidents, executive board leaders, and council executive board members participated in the SFL Advance Leadership program to learn about risk reduction, social media and marketing presence and Leading with Let Them.
- In February, SFL provided education to each of the four councils about travel safety, personal safety, and wellness during Spring Break. Resources, including presentation slides, a Safer Spring Break planning guide, and Safer Spring Break kits provided by HERO were shared with a delegate from each chapter.
 - 75% of students who attended the presentation at their council meeting reported that they felt very prepared to talk with their chapter members about planning for safety and wellness during Spring Break

Recruitment, Retention & Expansion

(Note retention and graduate data are provided once a year in the fall semester. Thus, that data is same from fall 2025)

- The All-SFL first year freshman member retention is 94.7% All-KU first-time freshmen retention of 87.5% and the non-SFL member first year freshmen retention of 84.7%.
 - This is a **1% increase** from the SFL retention rates from last year 93.7%.
- The SFL community totaled 4,673 members during the spring 2026 semester. This includes 3,281 sorority members and 1,392 fraternity members.
 - The overall community experienced a **9.95% increase** from spring 2025 (4,250 members).

- The sorority community experienced a **10.43% increase** from spring 2025 (2,971 members).
- The fraternity community experienced an **8.84% increase** from spring 2025 (1,279 members).
- Council growth is as follows:
 - IFC: **7.38% increase** from spring 2026 (1,309) vs spring 2025 (1,219).
 - MGC: **1.95% increase** from spring 2026 (157) vs spring 2025 (154).
 - NPHC: **14.10% increase** from spring 2026 (89) vs spring 2025 (78).
 - PHA: **11.40% increase** from spring 2026 (3,118) vs spring 2025 (2,799).
- Currently, 23.05% of the University of Kansas students are members of a fraternity or sorority.

Service & Philanthropy

- During the Spring 2026 semester, 41,839 hours of hands-on community service were completed by fraternity and sorority members. This is an average of 8.94 hours of service performed per member of the SFL community.
 - During the 2025-2026 academic year, the SFL community performed 79,211 hours of community service.
 - This is a **4.1% increase** from the 76,084 hours of community service completed in the 2024-2025 academic year.
- During the Spring 2026 semester, \$301,269 was raised for charities by sororities and fraternities. This is an average of \$64.42 raised per member of the SFL community.
 - During the 2025-2026 academic year, \$666,149 was raised for local and national philanthropic organizations by the SFL community.
 - This is a **47.7% increase** from the \$451,009.13 raised in the 2024-2025 academic year.
